


INVERLOCH SURFSIDE

Although it has been a lot quieter than normal and we are missing your smiling faces, we are keeping ourselves busy with grounds maintenance and ongoing improvements in the park—one of which is the beach shack. The plans for the upgrade and extension of the beach shack have now been finalised. We are very excited to share with you an impression of how the finished product will look and can't wait for construction to start.



Over the past few years sand dune erosion along the surf beach has been a hot topic of discussion. We are pleased to report Bass Coast Shire is making good headway in dealing with the erosion. On the Cape Paterson—Inverloch Road a wall has been constructed of around 500 tonnes of rock which creates a barrier to protect the road.



Meanwhile in front of the surf lifesaving club geo tech sandbags have been installed. Ongoing work to establish the wall continues and will protect the Surf Club from the winter king tides.

DISCOUNT FOR PRE-ARRANGED GUESTS

Inverloch Surfside offer discounted rates for your overnight guests. The special rate of \$15 per adult and \$7.50 per child under 18 per night applies to pre-registered guests only.

To be eligible for the discounts you must register your guests <u>PRIOR</u> to their stay & payment must be made on booking or on arrival for their stay.

Any fees that have not been, both, <u>notified and paid</u> for by the end of your guest stay will revert to the ad-hoc rates.

SMOKE ALARMS

Victorian Caravan Park Regulations state that:

'Smoke alarms for movable dwellings must be fitted to all UMDs, caravans and rigid annexes. Where mains power is supplied to the moveable dwellings, the smoke alarm must be connected to the mains power. Smoke alarms need to be installed on or near the ceiling.'

Note: Since all sites in the park are connected to mains power, battery operated smoke alarms do not meet safety requirements.

If there are still vans and cabins that have battery operated alarms, we request that you install a mains operated alarm as a matter of urgency.

It is also now a CFA requirement that all UMD's have a fire extinguisher and fire blanket installed, please ensure you have current extinguishers and blankets installed


