Hello Everyone,

We are looking forward to welcoming you all back for your 2019/20 summer holidays.

During the off season we have been very busy within the park. A very important upgrade that was made is the replacement of power heads in the front half of the park, work was undertaken and completed over 8 weeks and delivers a compact safe power unit to each site holder. The amenities block saw some rejuvenation also with a fresh coat of paint on both interior and exterior, the skylights were replaced, stainless steel bench tops were installed in the laundry and stainless steel cover plates were placed at the base of the shower and toilet doors. These works have significantly lightened up the interior of the amenities. We are making every effort to grow grass at the front of many sites, whilst we understand this may cause some inconvenience during your visit we would appreciate your co-operation in giving these areas the best chance to succeed. We will continue to work on these areas after the school holidays as we have not had much warmth in the ground making germination difficult and slow.

When you arrive for your Christmas holiday break you will notice the installation of shade sails over the children's play ground, providing much needed shade during those hot days and making it a more enjoyable space for your little ones.

Within the grounds of the park regular maintenance has been carried out with a visit from the arborist checking and trimming all of the trees. The park benches have been re-stained and the barbed wire has been removed from the front fence.

Offsite we have attended valuable information sessions one being at our local CFA. The presentation covered aspects of safety that are very important to our caravan park for example checking gas bottles, keeping your site free of possible fuel especially under your van, keeping road access available to emergency services (please do not park on the roadways) and discussion on fire restrictions. The CFA will attend the park this summer to provide further information.

We both participated in Restart a Heart Day coordinated by Ambulance Victoria. We learnt of the importance a defibrillator has in saving lives of people who go into cardiac arrest. With this information we have explored further into defibrillators and we have purchased one for the park. It will be located outside of the office mounted on the wall. We will organise a day where Ambulance Victoria come to the park and provide information and training for those who are interested in learning how to use a defibrillator (AED).

SMOKE ALARMS

Victorian Caravan Park Regulations state that:

'Smoke alarms for movable dwellings must be fitted to all UMDs, caravans and rigid annexes. Where mains power is supplied to the

moveable dwellings, the smoke alarm must be connected to the mains power. Smoke alarms need to be installed on or near the ceiling.'

Note: Battery operated smoke alarms do not meet this safety requirement.

If there are still vans and cabins that have battery operated alarms, we request that you install a mains operated alarm as a matter of urgency.

NEED A DOCTOR?

If you have an accident or aren't feeling well, but don't think you need to go to hospital, then the A'Beckett Medical Centre in Inverloch is open from

9am-12.30pm and 2pm- 5pm, Monday-Friday.

They provide a doctor at central consulting suites until 8pm. After 8pm our doctors are on call and can be contacted by calling our answering service on 56721333. If you need to speak to a doctor on call the answering service will arrange for you to speak to them. Please note fees apply for our after hours service.

OOT AND ABOOT

Cape Paterson

Janice and I and three of the kids spent just under three years living in Cape Paterson.

Things to do at Cape.

The Channel is a small, 50 m long beach fronted by a near continuous intertidal rock platform, with just a narrow, 5 m wide, straight channel through the centre of the platform. It is located immediately east of the main Cape Paterson Surf Beach and can easily be accessed along the beach. Waves average about 1 m and the beach face is steep and narrow at high tide, and fronted by exposed rock at low tide, apart from the surging channel. *Not Patrolled

The Cape Paterson Bay Beach is a crenulated, sheltered beach tucked in behind extensive rock platforms, reefs and a headland. The 400 m long, curving beach faces south west and is located adjacent to the centre of Cape Paterson township with a foreshore camping reserve and degraded foredune backing the beach. A boat ramp and car park are located at the western end. The Wonthaggi Life Saving Club, founded in 1938, is in the centre of the beach and is backed by a grassed playground and picnic area with parking and public amenities. This popular beach is ideal for families, anglers and divers alike, and includes a manmade rock pool on the beach. Waves average about 0.5 m and the beach is narrow and steep at high tide. Most of the rocks are covered by water, however at low tide more rocks than sand occupy the low tide area. *Patrolled

Do your self a favour and drop in and see Michael Turton the publican at the **Cape Tavern**. The menu is extensive and you can rest assured you will find a dish of your liking on this menu. The staff are very friendly and the Tavern offers entertainment during the summer, they also do the best wine dinners. Check out their facebook page to see what is happening whilst you are here on holidays.
