SMOKE ALARMS

Victorian Caravan Park Regulations state that:

'Smoke alarms for movable dwellings must be fitted to all UMDs, caravans and rigid annexes. Where mains power is supplied to the moveable dwellings, the smoke alarm must be connected to the mains power. Part 3/7.2.2(b) of the BCA requires that all smoke alarms must comply with AS3786—Smoke Alarms, and be installed on or near the ceiling.'

It is also now a CFA requirement that all UMD's have a fire extinguisher and fire blanket installed. To comply with these regulations, please ensure you have current extinguishers and blankets installed in you van or cabin



VISITING TRADES



All electrical and plumbing work carried out on vans/cabins must be done by qualified tradespeople, and a certificate of compliance provided to the office.

Those who do not comply will not be able to on-sell their units to remain in the park.
