SURF PARADE PATHWAY

The extension of the foreshore shared path along Surf Parade in Inverloch, between Ayr Creek and Veronica Street, is complete and open to all recreational users. Future stages of the path from Veronica Street to Goroke Street, as part of the Surf Parade Inverloch Shared Path Master Plan will be subject to Council decision and the allocation of funds in future budgets.

BOOM GOES THE GATE!

As you all probably aware, Inverloch has a number of power outages throughout the year, this results in the management team having to lift the booms on the gate in order for you to enter and exit the park.



However, to ensure that you will be able to enter or exit when the power is restored, it is imperative that you still swipe in and out even when the booms are not operational.

BUTT OUT!

For the smokers out there, please remember to completely stub your cigarette out before throwing it into the bin, we have had a small fire in the bin over the busy season and luckily one of the site owners noticed and extinguished it immediately, thank you to those people, they know who they are....

The same applies to hot coals, please ensure they are extinguished before emptying your waste into the skips, as you are all aware fire can spread so quickly and we value the safety of our site holders and visitors.

There is a lot of public support for smoke free outdoor areas, especially in areas where children are commonly present. Protecting the health of the public, particularly children, has also been a significant factor driving the introduction of smoking bans in a variety of public places.

In Victoria, the following public outdoor areas are now smoke free, which includes our children's playground and oval:

• within 10 metres of children's playgrounds, skate parks and underage sporting events

• patrolled beaches in the area between the red and yellow flags, and within a 50 metre radius of the red and yellow flags (reference : Quit line website)



DISCOUNT FOR PRE-ARRANGED GUESTS

Inverloch Surfside offer discounted rates for your overnight guests. The special rate of \$15 per adult and \$7.50 per child under 18 per night applies to preregistered guests <u>only</u>.

To be eligible for the discounts you must register your guests <u>PRIOR</u> to their stay & payment must be made before they leave. Ways to register :

- Phone call
- Text
- Email
- Call into the office (during office hours)
- Note, through letter drop in the front door.

Standard rates of \$30 per adult or \$15 per child per night will apply if the office has not been notified.

Please note that you are responsible for the payment of the account if your guests do not pay in time and the full rate will apply.

POWER SURGES

Inverloch experiences quite a few power outages as well as possible surges through out the year.

We would suggest that people turn their power off when they leave to avoid any food spoils if circuit breakers are tripped during these events .

Also be aware that all our sites have 15 amps of supply to them. If you are running small heaters with any other appliance's you may over load your circuit breaker.

WATER

As you would all be aware via our text messages over the past month, we have had a few water issues within the park. There has been 2 separate instances with burst water pipes. Unfortunately, neither of the pipes advised us prior of their intentions to allow for notice to be given. Whilst we try our very best not to inconvenience site holders, sometimes we don't plan for them to occur therefore no notice can be given.

When planned works are carried out in the park, they are schedule during the off season and if the works effect any particular sites, these sites are made aware of the works and approximate time frames.

GAS

Whilst you are not in attendance at the park we request that all gas bottles be turned off, both the LPG 45I cylinders and your bbq bottles.

We recommend regular gas testing performed by a licenced Gas Plumber. This is compulsory for those selling their cabin/van but we highly recommend this for all sites. After all, SAFETY IS PRIORITY!

PREVENTING GAS FIRES AND EXPLOSIONS ON BBQ

Always check for leaks, using the soapy water test. Inspect the hose for cracks and other deteriorations on a regular basis. Replace the hose and regulator assembly every 5 years. Keep gas bottles upright at all times.

If you find a leak, turn off the gas bottle immediately!

Do not turn back on or attempt to use the BBQ until the problem is rectified.



SMOKE ALARMS

Victorian Caravan Park Regulations state that:

'Smoke alarms for movable dwellings must be fitted to all UMDs, caravans and rigid annexes.

Where mains power is supplied to the moveable dwellings, the smoke alarm must be connected to the mains power. Part 3/7.2.2(b) of the BCA requires that all smoke alarms must comply with

AS3786—Smoke Alarms, and be installed on or near the ceiling.

It is also now a CFA requirement that all UMD's have a fire extinguisher and fire blanket installed.

To comply with these regulations, please ensure you have current extinguishers and blankets installed in your van or cabin.

SCOOTERS

Just a reminder that VicRoads regulations state that the driver of a motorised scooter which has the capability of travelling more than 10kmh, is powered by petrol or has a maximum power of more than 200 watts is classified as a motor vehicle and can only be used on the road if it is registered and the rider has a motorcycle licence or learner permit. These motorised scooters are unable to be ridden in the park without a licence.

Helmets must also be worn by ALL cyclists.

Please help us keep you and your children safe, and obey the rules.

EMERGENCY!

Emergency services have 24-hour access to the park and if you have a need to call police, ambulance or fire services, you should do so.

However, please remember to notify management immediately after making the call, once it is safe to do so.

It is important that we are aware of what's going on in the park both for your safety and the safety of others.

STORAGE SHEDS/CONTAINERS

Bass Coast Council have confirmed storage sheds and large containers must be removed from some of our sites. Why you ask? "The minimum width required for firefighter access and fire separation must be provided between and around each structure in the caravan park " For more information contact the office or see the CFA Guidelines.

We have commenced working with sites to remove the affected units. If you think your unit falls under this category, please discuss with Management.

SITE AUDITS

A huge thank you to all who responded so positively to the site audits, it is much appreciated!

There are however, still a few issues that remain outstanding. We would appreciate if these items could be rectified to comply with the parks request.

Ongoing improvements and maintenance to the appearance and ambience of the park are in the interests of everyone.

It's great to see so many of you enjoying your little slice of paradise with your family and friends. We would like to take this opportunity to remind you that whilst we love having your guests enjoy our park, it is your responsibility to ensure that they are registered at the office, and are informed of all the park rules, including what to do in an emergency and the park speed limit. After all, our park is for everybody's enjoyment.

LAUNDRY ETIQUETTE

With so many of us using the laundry facilities we would like to remind everyone of the laundry etiquette.

A common complaint being heard is laundry being left in machines all day or for some hours whilst other site holders are lining up to use the machines. Please do not put your washing on then leave the park for the day. If your laundry is left unattended, please do not be offended, if upon your return, your washing is left on the bench.



Approximate times for the washing machine is 30 minutes, dryers for every one dollar is 15 minutes.

A reminder that the laundry also has a book library for you to borrow or swap books with other site holders. Please only leave books, no magazines, games or other unwanted items are to be left.

CAMPING

As per your agreement there is no tents, swags or camping around sites. To accommodate your family/friends, we have 4 tent sites and 1 caravan/camper site available around the edge of the oval. These sites can only be booked through site holders, they have power but no water, and are available all year around, except 20th December, 2018—6th January, 2019. Please book your sites through the office. All sites are paid in advance and no refund upon cancellation.





SPEED

The speed limit is a constant reminder throughout the park, whilst most drivers do the right thing, some still insist on driving over the 5km limit. The park-imposed 5km speed limit is not there to annoy you, it's there to keep everybody safe. Whilst driving around the park, if you have an automatic car, your foot should be on the brake, not the accel-

Parents, now is the time to remind the kids too, they are not to race each other around the park, sneak up and try and overtake cars or tailgate them. They too need to obey the rules.

Those that continue to break the speed limit may have their vehicle access removed for a period of time.



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
